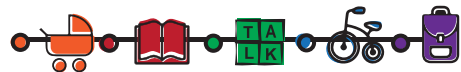


Hi, families! Use this sheet as a guide to read, talk and play with your child in the grocery store.

Narrate your shopping trip to help your baby learn!



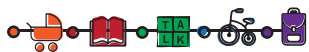
-  **Something yellow**
